Organisation

Regional Facilitators

The regional facilitators have provided five talks or workshops, in Auckland, Christchurch, Hamilton and Dunedin.

Intern

We are hosting an intern from Victoria University of Wellington, who will help complete research and writing tasks into open educational resources.

Funding and Partnerships

We are meeting the reporting requirements of both InternetNZ and LINZ. Please see the funding update for more details.

Affiliate Community

Matt continues to participate in the open education affiliate calls with Creative Commons HQ.

Open Calls

We are starting to participate in calls with advocates and volunteers from our target sectors. We are trialing an open education in tertiary call, and are seeing if there is demand for an open GLAM call.

Mentors and Volunteers

We are closing the mentors programme, to be replaced with a new and improved volunteer programme.

Projects

General: Links with CC Australia

Matt has made contact with Delia Browne, who is the Education Lead for CC Australia. Delia and Matt have agreed to have regular catch-ups to share knowledge and collaborative opportunities.

General: Website development

We are making cosmetic changes to both NZCommons.org.nz and creativecommons.org.nz, to make the connections between the sites more obvious, and ensure some continuity of branding. We are also looking to make changes to resources.creativecommons.org.nz, to transform the site from a general repository to several structured toolkits

General: NZCommons

We are continuing our series of posts on NZCommons. We are considering introducing regular writers, and transforming the site into a multi-author blog.

General: OS / OS and Billy Meinke

Billy Meinke, formerly of Creative Commons HQ, gave an excellent keynote at the Open Source / Open Society conference, April 16-17, in Wellington. We supported his travel to this conference. Billy also helped provide several workshops during the week.

General: Creative Commons Book

Elizabeth has been working with Whitereia Polytechnic publishing students to produce the draft to a Creative Commons book. I will circulate an introduction for comment.

General: New Resources

The resources.creativecommons.org.nz is up and running. We are currently working on a CC handbook for teachers and an introductory policy paper for OERs in tertiary education. We are also in the early stages of planning a CC in Schools video, an A3 CC poster to distribute via a national schools publication, as well as an OER policy paper, outlining CCANZ's recommendations in the tertiary education sector.

Schools: March Events

We held nine events for schools across the country during our March roadtrip, out of twenty-two events in total.

Schools: Network for Learning

Introductory information on Creative Commons has been included in the Network for Learning's Pond.

Schools: Cable Green and ULearn

Global Education Manager for Creative Commons, Cable Green is speaking at ULearn in October.

Schools: CC Policies

We have released a list of the first ninety schools with Creative Commons policies, as well as a list of ten further schools with CC policies in consultation.

Research: Marsden Fund

David Nichols from Waikato University is looking to data on the relative closure of Marsden-funded research. I am in talks with the new Senior Manager of Research Funding, with the aim of reigniting the conversation on Open Access at the Marsden Council.

Heritage: March Events

We held eleven heritage events during March, and are continuing to provide follow-up events for those who could not attend.

Heritage: NDF

We have established a relationship with the National Digital Forum Regional Reps, who are keen to include Creative Commons in their regional barcamps.

Heritage: LIANZA

We have been offered a free stall at the LIANZA conference in November. We are also working with LIANZA to record an CC and Open GLAM Webinar in July.

Indigenous Knowledge: Notice

Susy Frankel has finished drafting the notice, and has promised to release a draft shortly.

Indigenous Knowledge: Translation

The translation of the 4.0 licences into te reo Māori is complete, and HQ have approved the translation. We expect to publish the licences within the month.

Tertiary Education: OER Calls

We have expanded the regular OER calls with Richard White and Simon Hart at the University of Otago to include others from the sector.
