# **Update on CCANZ Public Lead Activities, September to December 2013**

## **Funding**

CCANZ continues to work with a range of organisations to secure sustainable funding post June 2014.

## **Interns**

CCANZ is advertising for two new interns for the summer holidays, to help produce a range of new web resources.

## **Print Resources**

### *Open Access in Aotearoa*

4000 12 page Open Access guides have been printed and distributed to every university library and several polytechnic libraries.

### *CC Policies for Schools*

5000 Creative Commons policy brochures have been printed. Several hundred of these have been distributed, with wider distribution planned for early next year.

## **Media**

### *Press Releases*

CCANZ published media releases on Mix & Mash and the 'Media Text Hack' project.

### *Radio Active*

Matt appeared with Thomasin Sleigh on Radio Active's weekday drive-time show to promote Mix & Mash.

### *Media Text Hack*

A variety of outlets covered the open textbook project, including the ODT, Idealog and Techday.<sup>1</sup> I am in touch with other outlets who are interested in covering the project upon its completion in 2014.

### *Social Media*

We now have over 2030 Twitter followers. The email list has over 140 subscribers.

## **Projects and Partners**

### *Mix & Mash 2013*

The Supreme Awards for Mix & Mash were announced on Tuesday 3 December. An exhibition of Mix & Mash entries will be on the ground floor of the National Library for the next twelve months.

### *Creative Commons Policies*

At least twelve schools have CC policies, with at least ten more currently introducing policies to their BoTs.

#### *Open Textbook Project*

Managed by a team at the University of Otago, a group of writers and academics across New Zealand and Australia spent the weekend on 16-17 November writing an open textbook. The story was covered in various outlets, and received some international interest. This open textbook project is funded by an affiliates grant to CCANZ from CCHQ.

#### *CCANZ and Indigenous Knowledge*

A wide ranging meeting on Creative Commons licensing and Indigenous Knowledge was held on 1 November.<sup>2</sup>

#### *Website Redesign*

An initial redesign of the website is complete. I will work with CCANZ's summer interns to rewrite and redesign CCANZ's other web resources, as well as revisit current changes. I have started to re-draft the 'Licences Explained' section of the website.<sup>3</sup>

#### *Open Access Week*

CCANZ published a range of posts for Open Access Week 2013.<sup>4</sup>

#### *Creative Commons Mentors*

The initial group of Creative Commons Mentors was announced on 2 December.<sup>5</sup>

#### *Transactions and Proceedings of the Royal Society of New Zealand, 1868-1961*

The *Transactions & Proceedings* will be given a new 'Copyright and Reuse' statement, ensuring that all in copyright works for which RSNZ holds copyright will be licensed CC-BY. The statement will also clarify which works are likely to be out-of-copyright.

#### *Loomio*

The Loomio community is slowly building. There have already been a range of useful suggestions for work in 2014.

#### *Public Domain Calculator*

Following a suggestion from Victoria Leachman, I followed up the idea of NZ joining the Open Knowledge Foundation's Public Domain Calculator project. I've also been in touch with a colleague at CC Netherlands, who built the only functional Public Domain Calculator, and OKFN France, who have received a grant to 'map the public domain.'
