

Update on CCANZ Chair of Advisory Panel Activities, February to May 2014

1. UPDATES

1.1. UoA OA Policy working group

The first meeting of the working group took place on March 24. The enthusiasm from members of the group and the commitment to get this policy right was made evident. Each member of the group was tasked with compiling all relevant information relating to a specific issue at hand. I was tasked with reviewing issues relating to Copyright. The next meeting is to be held on May 15. All members of the group have been made aware of and have been encouraged to attend Keitha Booth's presentation at the UoAKL on May 26.

1.2. New Zealand Open Source Awards

I have had a discussion with Don Christie about having a more prominent celebration of Creative Commons licence use as part of the NZOSA. Don seemed keen and open to the idea, despite it being clear that CCANZ would not be able to provide financial contribution to the event. From this preliminary conversation one possibility is to have CC licencing as part of the Science and Arts category, and to exploit these categories to highlight the role of CC licences. I was also asked to join again the judging panel. A possible sponsorship of the event by CCANZ was discussed, but no decision was made.

1.3. New Zealand Association of Scientists

I was invited to give a short presentation on the "Science and Society" in my role as Chair of this panel. The meeting was held on April 5 at the University of Auckland and the slides of my presentation can be found on [Slideshare.net/kubke](http://slideshare.net/kubke).

1.4. Kiwifoo

Kiwi Foo was held 11-13 April. There was a large number of scientists who explored the value of research in New Zealand. Of particular interest is an opportunity to work with Dean Peterson on a proposal to the Marsden Council and an interest from Mark Wilson (U Auckland) to try to map the actual costs of subscriptions and Open Access to the tertiary sector in NZ.

1.5. New Zealand eResearch Symposium

The New Zealand [eResearch Symposium](#) will be held at Waikato University, June 30-July 2. Waikato is the home of the globally recognised machine learning

data analytics research group led by Professor Ian Witten, and the first landing place for the Internet in New Zealand. Waikato is an appropriate home for three days of discussions on the major opportunities and challenges related to applying advanced computing to research.

2. NEW BUSINESS

2.1. Open Education Week and Open Access Week

Born from a lengthy Twitter conversation, a group of us (Stephen Harlow, Waikato; Nigel Robertson, Waikato; Mark McGuire, Otago, Wayne Mackintos and myself) held an ad hoc meeting on march 13 to try to identify what the tertiary sector could/should be doing around Open Education Week (2015) and Open Access Week (2014, 2015). One idea is to have both events work with each other. A possible involvement of CCANZ with this was discussed (see Agenda item (4.1)

2.2. Kaitlin Thaney to visit New Zealand

Kaitlin will be visiting New Zealand and Australia as part of her invitation to deliver a Plenary at this year's NZ [eResearch Symposium](#) (at Waikato University, June 30-July 2). Kaitlin is the current Director at [Mozilla Science Labs](#) and is in the Board of Directors of [DataKind](#), an organisation that uses Data Science for the benefit of humanity. Kaitlin is also a founding member at the [e-Infrastructure Leadership Council](#) and former Program Manager of Science at Creative Commons.

In association with the leadership of NZ eResearch we are organising events to maximise the value of Kaitlin's visit.

2.3. GigaScience -An Open Access / Open Data journal

Giga Science is part of the BioMed Central group that publishes the articles, the associated data and data analysis tools and cloud-computing resources. Nicole Nogoy, the Commissioning Editor, is based in Wellington.

2.4. Contributing to OA policies / contracts

I was contacted by a Council member of Internet New Zealand asking advice on how to include an Open Access clause to their research contracts. I passed on advice received from Matt and Keitha at the time. However, this request seems to come up on occasion, and it might be useful to consider whether CCANZ could have at hand examples of how these terms are written in different types of research contracts to provide as exemplars (see Agenda 4.6).

3.1. My thanks go to Melanie Johnson who helped me re-write the licencing terms of the video recordings made of my panel presentation at the Open Brain Day.
